There were times I wanted to wrap Sarah up in a blanket and protect her at all costs and times when I just wanted to be all honey no: It was funny raw and real and while the writing wasn't the perfect the heart behind the story was: 321 I liked the book but I found the author a little sad, She was so dependent on psychics and boyfriends for her self-worth, That's ironic isn't it? To be dependent on someone else for your SELF worth. 321 Wanting to step outside of familiar reading territory I picked this book up off my bookshelf, At some points I was laughing so hard I had to set the book down and at other times I found myself wanting to slap her for not looking at the obvious: This is a good light read and not only is it about her addiction to psychics it's also about man trouble and following ones dreams, They want to know what's going to happen and that everything is going to be okay. While Sarah does a great job describing the obsession she gets with psychics she doesn't do as great a job describing the reasons that pushed her there to begin with. We see her meet Wilhelm and from the description we get he's not very attractive, his personality is fairly boring and there is no physical attraction or even, I'm sure there had to be more to the relationships she had
